Scholarships

The Morden Area Foundation takes great pride in holding scholarship funds to support the future of Morden's youth.

Contact the MAF office for more details.

Unless stated, applications are made through the Morden Collegiate Institution and distributed at the grad ceremony.

Bill & Linda Fehr Scholarship - \$500 for a mature student or past graduate out of school for a minimum of one year or longer and wishing to return to a community college or other post-secondary institution for further education. To apply, please refer to "Scholarship" on the MAF website.

Doug Cram Memorial Bursary - \$460 is awarded to a student pursuing post-secondary education in the field of agriculture, economic development, or technology, and who has shown academic achievement at school.

Diane McAndrew Scholarship - \$300 is awarded to students continuing their studies in university in the field of education. The recipient must be in the top 25% of their class and demonstrate leadership within the school community, as well as athletic or cultural achievement.

Jake Kenneth Warkentin Scholarship - \$370 is awarded to students who are interested in the field of social work, counseling, international development, or conflict resolution. The student must also demonstrate compassion and service for marginalized or disabled persons.

Joe (Johannes) and Annie Olafson Scholarship - \$400 is awarded to a rural student who is a Grade 12 graduate within the Western School Division catchment area with an average of 80% or higher who demonstrates a positive attitude and intends to pursue post-secondary studies in the nursing field. If there is no application for nursing studies, then a graduate who intends to pursue an interest in post-secondary studies in an agricultural field will be accepted.

John & Isabel Reichert Scholarship - \$900 to students wishing to pursue post-secondary studies in the field of education. Criteria include academic merit, extra-curricular activity, classroom performance, a caring, helpful attitude, and who need financial assistance.

Morden Area Foundation Scholarship - \$1,200 is granted to a student with high academic standing, is involved in extra-curricular activities in the school or community, and continuing their studies at the post-secondary level.

Morden Area Foundation Adult Education Scholarship - \$1,200 is awarded to a graduate of the Adult Education program who is entering post-secondary studies and recognizing the student's determination, some of whom have overcome major obstacles, to achieve further education. To apply, please contact Kelly Vipond at the Adult Education center.

Morden Collegiate Student Council Bursary - \$155 is presented to a student demonstrating a strong academic performance and pursuing post-secondary education.

Morden Festival of the Arts Scholarship - \$250 is awarded to students in recognition of outstanding talents in disciplines including dance, piano, strings, speech, voice, drama, band, and vocal choral.

Morden Masonic Lodge Scholarship - \$700 is presented to a student with a high academic standing who is continuing their education in the field of nursing.

Rebekah Lodge Scholarship - \$100 is presented to a student who excelled in Family Studies 40S.

Richard, Emma & Leonard Krueger Scholarship - \$235 is granted to students who have an average of 75% or better in their Senior 4 courses and who are continuing their studies at a university in the medical field and who are non-smokers residing in the 1-6 area or rural area surrounding Morden.

Youth In Philanthropy (YIP)/Hopeful Aware Students taking Action (HASTA) Scholarship - \$600 is presented to a student who demonstrates leadership within the school and community. The student must be caring, helpful, and have a positive attitude.

Youth In Philanthropy



YIP is a fun and exciting way for youth who care about their communities to unleash their ideas, create plans, and partner together in support of one another in their community.

The Morden Area Foundation (MAF) partners with the local YIP members in education, policies, CRA granting rules, and most importantly ... matching money to grant to the community.

The Grade 3's at the Minnewasta School had a good idea that grew into something more for local furry friends. They held a bake sale that raised \$257.65. They were going to donate the monies directly to the Pembina Valley Humane Society (PVHS) but decided to partner with the Morden Area Foundation to create an even larger grant to the PVHS for the much-needed new cat and dog beds at the shelter.

Students Mia Brass and Austin Dyck made a presentation to the Morden Area Foundation (MAF) as to why they wanted to donate to the PVHS. The Grade 3's had gone to a lot of great work learning about non-profits, choosing a local non-profit organization to donate to, making a plan on how to raise monies, and then completing the plan. The MAF Board was so impressed by their work, the Board chose to team up with the Grade 3's by offering a matching grant for \$257.

Together the Grade 3's and the MAF granted \$514 to PVHS.

They held an annual Taco in a Bag sale that raised \$710. Students also raised \$28.55 selling slime totaling \$738.55. The MAF Board always enjoys matching funds for such keen and avid fundraisers and agreed to grant a total of \$1,477.10 to Katie's Cottage as shown in the photo above for the purchase of Beanie Babies.

It was Katie Reimer who started this tradition when she was sick in hospital in Winnipeg. She saw children there who needed comfort and Katie therefore asked her mother Ruth to purchase a teddy bear for them. This tradition is now carried on at Katie's Cottage today wherein sick kids in



hospital will receive a Beanie Baby to comfort them.

Power of the Purse



Once again 100 dynamic, vibrant, and passionate women were invited to bring \$100, listen to presentations of three local charities with specific projects, and donate \$100 to charity of their individual choice that is closest to their heart.

The goal is to raise and grant out \$10,000 within 100 minutes with 100 women with \$100.

Sue was nominated by Edith Lovatt and Freda Lumgair. Sue Nelson moved to Morden 30 years ago with her family. Sue and Ted purchased the Morden Pharmacy, which later became Shoppers Drug Mart, where Sue was the lead pharmacist.

Sue was a Girl Guide leader for over 20 years and was honored with provincial awards for her service to Girl Guides. Sue has been involved with the St. Pauls United Church and is the lead fundraiser for the Mission and Service Fund for more than 20 years. She was the Church Board Secretary, outreach representative, Mission and Service

representative, Sunday School teacher, Stephen Ministry participant, fall supper organizer to name a few. One of Sue's passions is working on social justice issues: poverty, housing, reconciliation, fair trade, food security issues. Sue served on the Many Hands Community Resource Centre board from 2012 to 2014. 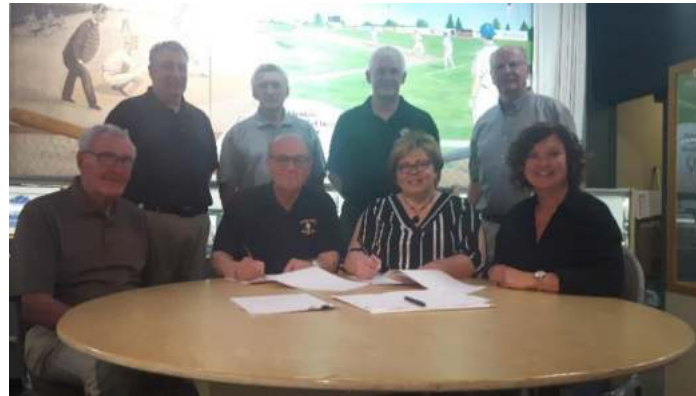

The nominee's service to the community will have occurred over an extended period of time and not focused solely on one singular event or activity. Nominees must have made a significant contribution toward the future of our community through conservation projects, education, health and welfare projects, awareness of and/or advocacy to the development of Morden. LIST OF FUNDS HELD AT THE MORDEN AREA FOUNDATION

Arts Stabilization Manitoba Fund - restricted – interest from this fund is used in support of equipment for and professional development of the Pembina Hills Arts Centre.

Canadian Fossil Discovery Development Fund – restricted – investment earnings from this fund are to support activities of the CFDC.

Caring and Sharing Fund – restricted - investment earnings are used by Caring and Sharing to pay for food, clothing, or other needs of children and families.

City of Morden – unrestricted - interest from this fund is for all registered charities to apply to for local projects.

Clark Elder Memorial Fund – restricted – investment earnings are used to support families needing assistance to pay for children in sports related activities.

General Community Fund - unrestricted – interest from this fund is for all registered charities to apply to for local projects.

Lautenschlager Family Fund - restricted – in the building stage, no grants available at present.

Morden Corn & Apple Festival Fund – restricted – interest from this fund is to assist in payment of any and all expenses incurred by the Morden Corn & Apple Festival.

Recreation and Sport Fund (This includes the original Safeway Summer Games Fund and the 2014 Morden Stanley Winkler Power Smart Winter Games Fund) – unrestricted – investment earnings are focused on sports related grants.

South Central Cancer Resource – restricted – interest from this fund is to assist in payment of any expenses incurred for the general operations of SCCR.

South Central Regional Library Fund – restricted – investment earnings are to assist in payment of any expenses incurred by SCRL as deemed appropriate by the SCRL Board for the general operations of SCRL.

Support Fund – interest from this fund helps to cover all office administration costs.

Women's Giving Fund – unrestricted – interest from this fund is used for grants focused on women and children.
