## CFDC "Dig Deep" Gala

In May, the Canadian Fossil Discovery Centre held a very successful 2<sup>nd</sup> annual fundraising gala with profits from ticket sales, donations, and auction, used to build their Canadian Fossil Discovery Development Fund to a whopping \$30,000!

Dr. Anthony Russell was asked to speak on "The Life of Dr. Elizabeth 'Betsy' Nichols". Betsy spent three field seasons in the bentonite quarries collecting and conducting research for her thesis, from 1985-1987. With the support of two summer helpers and Henry Isaak (Curator of Morden & District Museum at the time) she helped to bring in numerous specimens, some of which included the huge plesiosaur pelvic girdle currently on display in our gallery.

This fund was created specifically for the interest earned to be used to help support the activities of the CFDC and therefore the CFDC Board is actively working hard to create one of the largest funds held with the MAF.





## **Power of the Purse**

The Power of the Purse began as part of a Women's Giving Circle Fund initiative. 100 women were invited to bring \$100

each totaling \$10,000. On Saturday, March 4 three registered charities, preselected and applications approved by the MAF, made 15 minute presentations followed by each woman individually choosing the charity they wish to support with their \$100 donation.

The three projects of choice were:

- 1. Pembina Valley Child Care Centre funding for Baby Room equipment and supplies \$2,683.27 awarded.
- 2. Agassiz Medical Clinic Community Board funding for a new Teen Clinic \$3,209.27 awarded.
- 3. Alzheimer's Society Funding for the very first in the area Minds In Motion Program \$4,108.46 awarded.

#### **Fund Investments**

The Winnipeg Foundation is responsible for all Morden Area Foundation fund investments. In addition to handling all MAF investments, TWF offers free training and educational sessions to the MAF Board members, are available by telephone or email Monday to Friday for any and all questions the Executive Director or Board Members may have, plus offers additional grants to the MAF to assist in administration costs.

As at August 31, the MAF fiscal year end for 2016-2017, the MAF total investments amounted to \$1,609,704.68.

## **Funds Held at the MAF**

NEW Morden Corn & Apple Festival Fund – restricted – interest from this fund is to assist in payment of any and all expenses incurred by the Morden Corn & Apple Festival.

NEW South Central Cancer Resource – restricted – interest from this fund is to assist in payment of any expenses incurred for the general operations of SCCR.

Administration Fund – interest from this fund helps to cover all office administration costs.

**General Fund** - unrestricted – interest from this fund is for all registered charities to apply to for local projects.

Women's Giving Fund – unrestricted – interest from this fund is used for grants focused on women and children.

City of Morden – unrestricted - interest from this fund is for all registered charities to apply to for local projects.

**Caring and Sharing Fund** – restricted - Investment earnings are used by Caring and Sharing to pay for food, clothing, or other needs of children and families.

Health and Education Fund – unrestricted - interest earned is for all registered charities to apply to for local projects.

Games Fund – unrestricted – investment earnings are focused on sports related grants.

Recreation and Sport Fund (This includes the original Safeway Summer Games Fund) - unrestricted Canadian Fossil Discovery Development Fund – restricted – investment earnings from this fund are to support activities of the CFDC.

Clark Elder Memorial Fund – restricted – investment earnings are used to support families needing assistance to pay for children in sports related activities.

Arts Stabilization Manitoba Fund - restricted – interest from this fund is used in support of equipment for and professional development of the Pembina Hills Arts Centre. South Central Regional Library Fund – restricted – investment earnings are to assist in payment of any expenses incurred by SCCR as deemed appropriate by the SCCR Board for the general operations of SCCR.

2017 marks **Canada's 150th Celebration** and with that the Community Foundations of Canada offered a Canada 150 matching grant opportunity wherein 50% is granted by the MAF and 50% is matched and granted through the Canada 150 program. In the photo above the Pembina Valley Child Care Centre in Morden was granted \$14,910 for the resurfacing of the infant/toddler playground.



This year as part of the "Kids helping Kids Program" the Morden Collegiate Youth In Philanthropy (YIP) has partnered with the EMMS Grade 5's Pay it Forward Club and the Morden Area Foundation, in granting a total of \$2,375 to the Pembina Valley Child Care Centre for a new balance beam to be used by kids of all ages. The EMMS students held a Taco in a Bag fundraising lunch raising \$775. The YIP students raised \$375 through a garage sale, bake sale, and popcorn sales. The Foundation topped up these funds raised to fulfill the granting need as requested. Team work!

This program has been awesome for the youth of Morden. Individually they may not reach the goal but working together in partnership brings power to the youth and teaches them they can make great impact on their community. Kids helping kids is how it all begins.
